

Vision



The proposal, created by the Parramatta River Catchment Group, aims to make three new sections of the river swimmable by 2025 as crease the health of the waterway.




A hidden gen in the middle of a busy City

The Lake Parramatta Reserve is popular among solo visitors and groups alike, with the majority of visitors being aged 25+.







